Entry is open to:

- any group or organisation with an excellent and/or promising safety or injury prevention initiative;
- any individual who has made a significant contribution to creating a safer community.

Winners receive \$2000 towards professional development and/or the development of their safety initiative.

The finalists and award winners will be announced at an Awards Ceremony during the 2008 NZ Safety Week 1st -5th September 2008. Each entry is encouraged to attend the Awards Ceremony. SCFNZ will arrange travel and pay for one finalist from each category to attend the Awards Ceremony. This is likely to be a lunch-time event; however the exact timing and location for the Awards Ceremony will be confirmed later.

Categories

Category 1 – Emerging community safety and/or injury prevention initiative or programme

Judging Criteria:

- Demonstrates how all relevant community safety stakeholders have been engaged as part of the initiative's implementation;
- Demonstrates that it is addressing an important injury issue for your community;
- Shows effective use of available resources; and
- Has the potential to be applied and developed elsewhere.

Category 2: Outstanding community safety and/or injury prevention initiative or programme

Judging Criteria:

- Uses data to inform development and sustainability;
- Uses proven and promising community-based safety promotion and injury prevention strategies;
- Covers both genders, all ages, environments and situations or targets high-risk groups and environments;
- Incorporates evaluation to assess the programme, processes, reach and effects of change; and
- Has the potential to be applied and developed elsewhere.

Category 3: Outstanding example of how the New Zealand Injury Prevention Strategy (NZIPS) framework had guided the development of a community safety and/or injury prevention initiative or programme

Judging Criteria:

- Demonstrates alignment with the vision and objectives of NZIPS;
- Demonstrates alignment with one or more aspects of the NZIPS implementation plan;
- Addresses one or more priority areas for NZIPS;
- Incorporates evaluation to assess processes, reach and effects of change; and
- Fosters leadership within the community.

NB: Applications under this category can focus on one or more objective of NZIPS or demonstrate how their initiative has used the NZIPS framework.

Category 4: Outstanding business or organisation that is contributing to the greater well-being of its own workforce and the community in general

Judging Criteria:

- Shows collaboration and partnerships with community groups and organisations working towards common goals of injury reduction and well-being in the community;
- Demonstrates initiatives to improve the health and well-being of the workforce and the community, beyond the prevention of injuries in the workplace;
- Incorporates evaluation to assess processes, reach and effects of change; and
- Shows that the employer has an awareness and appreciation of the community, and is working towards the greater well-being of the community;
